History: The Birth of the Movement

- 1935: The experience with four youth in «Lot et Garonne» :
 - ✿ Monitoring by the priest for the parish
 - ✿ Alternating cycle of the work at the family farm and the work at school

- 1937: The families in the General Assembly, organized and bought a house. Then, was born the first «Maison Familiale" (Family House)

In the 70s

International support

- Continuation of the Expansion
- Creation of the AIMFR
- "Break" of many MFR, lack of national support
- Other European countries cooperate with developing countries

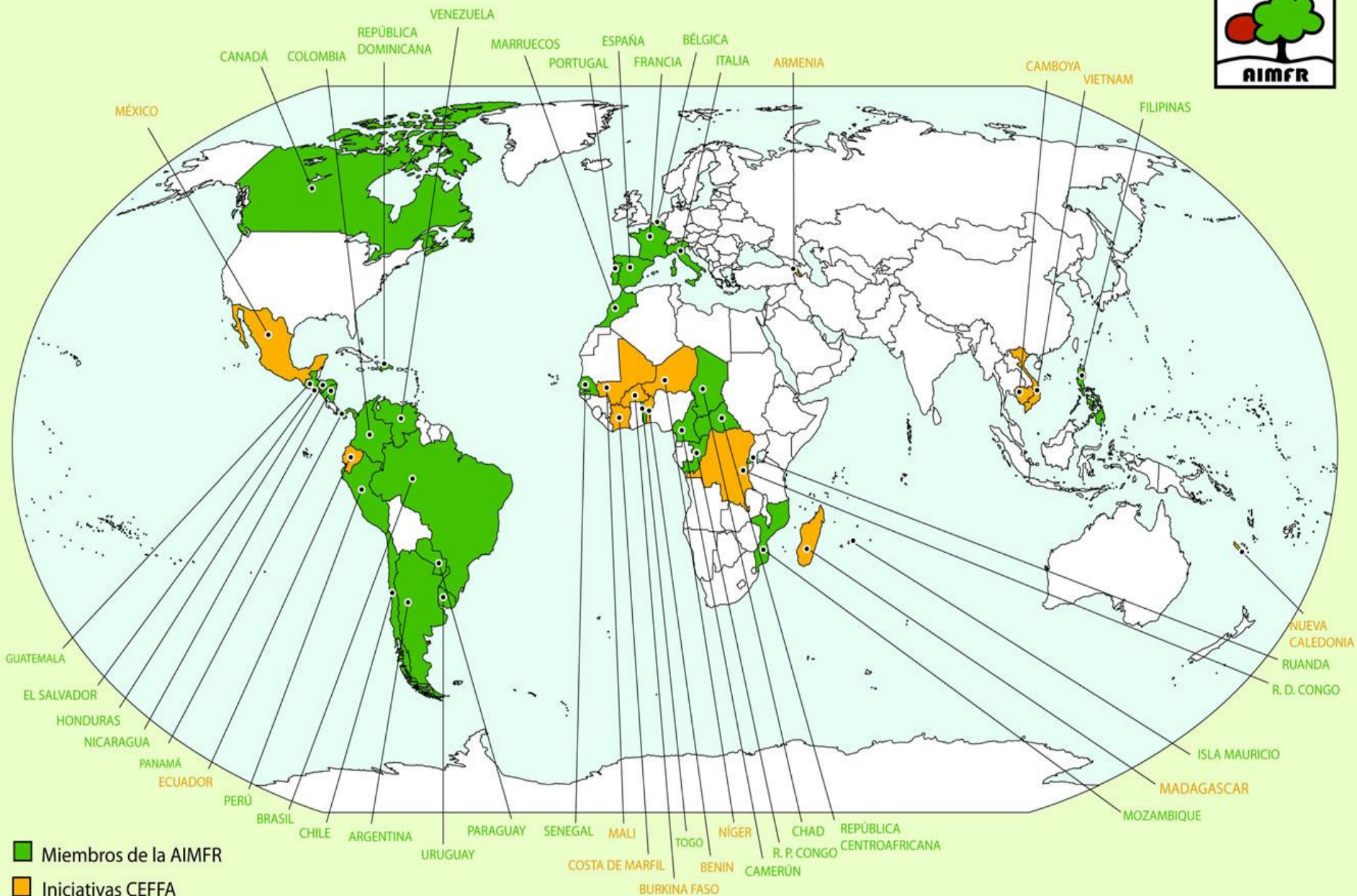


In the 80s and today (some examples):

- Africa: Mozambique (2003)

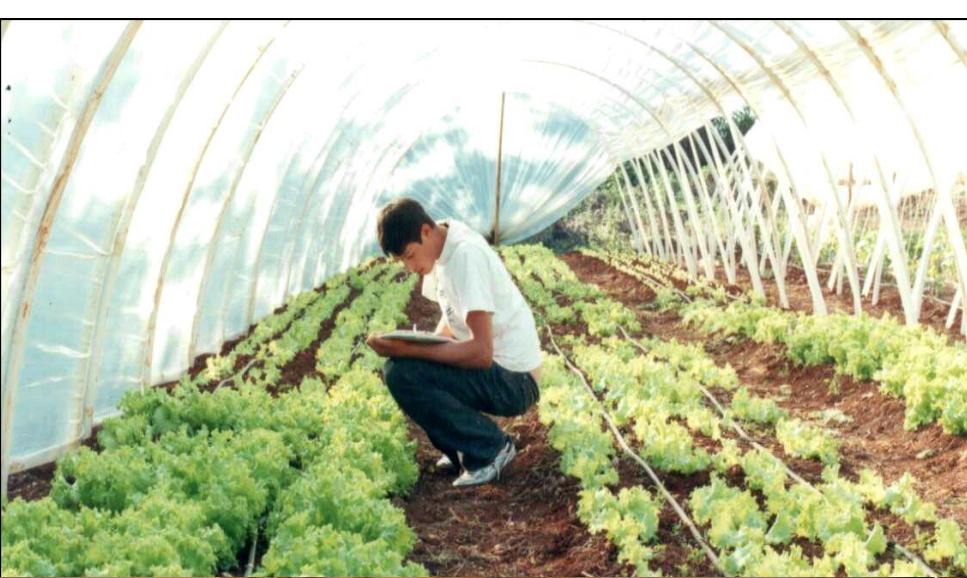
